The Arabic verb forms. Most Arabic words are derived from a three-letter (trilateral) root. And each trilateral Arabic root can theoretically be transformed into one of fifteen possible verb forms (أفعال, al-awzaan).(Forms 11 through 15 are very rare, so people usually just focus on forms 1 through 10, although 9 is also pretty rare).

For a typical verb based on a trilateral root (i.e. a root formed using three root consonants), the basic form is termed Form I, while the augmented forms are known as Form II, Form III, etc. The forms in normal use are Form I through Form X; Forms XI through XV exist but are rare and obsolescent.

This system also produces separate "strong" and "weak" forms of the verb — the strong guna form is used with the singular active, and the weak zero-grade form with the rest. In some verbs, the 3rd and optionally 1st person are further strengthened until the root syllable becomes heavy.
